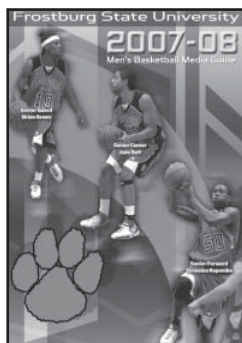

From an opening day enrollment of 57 students, Frostburg State University has grown to a present day enrollment of over 5,000 students.

Its physical plant, once limited to a single building, Old Main, which housed classrooms and a library, has also grown to over 30 facilities including classroom buildings, residence halls, the Lewis J. Ort Library, the Harold J. Cordts Physical Education Center, the Lane Center, and the Performing Arts Center, situated on 255 beautiful acres.

Opened in 1902 as State Normal School No. 2, the University owes its existence to the tenacity of J. Benson Oder, editor of the Frostburg Mining Journal, and the citizens of Frostburg who, in spite of political barriers, raised funds and purchased the site on which the University is located.

Principal Edmund Dandridge Murdaugh and three faculty instructed the first Normal School class; in addition, the other faculty taught 151 children in the Model School. The Normal School students, who were high school students having to meet no requirements other than age (girls, 16; boys, 17), had but one two-year course of study, elementary education. The curriculum consisted of Latin, mathematics, history, rhetoric and literature, natural and physical sciences, drawing, music, calisthenics, psychology, philosophy of education, philosophy of school management, Pedagogy, Observation, Practice Work and Primary Manual Training.

Over the years, the name of the institution has reflected the changes in the scope of its educational mission. In 1935, the State Normal School No. 2 became the State Teachers College at Frostburg, a four-year college which offered a Bachelor of Science in Elementary Education. In 1963, the name became Frostburg State College, and finally in 1987, with the strong support of the local civic and business community, became Frostburg State University, an indication of its growing resources, diversity and excellence in educational opportunities for the region and the state.

In 1988, FSU became a constituent institution of the University System of Maryland, comprised of 11 of the state's 13 public institutions. Expanding to meet the educational needs of the region, the FSU Center in Hagerstown was also established in 1988 to offer upper-level bachelor's degree coursework and graduate programs. The University also opened, in 1990, a permanent location for the Frederick MBA program.

Throughout its growth, the University has emphasized excellence in teaching. Over 80% of the full-time faculty hold Ph.D.s or terminal degrees from institutions that are among the most prestigious in the nation. Faculty scholarship has led to scholarly books, manuals and journals, as well as numerous articles and reviews. This excellence in faculty has resulted in superior results for students. FSU has been ranked first among its peers for the number of doctorates per 100 baccalaureate degrees awarded. In the same study, FSU was ranked second in the percentage of national, prestigious awards received by faculty. These have included Fulbrights and significant grants from the National Endowment for the Humanities, the National Endowment for the Arts and other national associations.

At the same time, the University has developed comparable excellence in academic programs, research, consulting, cultural and athletic events, and facilities. In recent years the campus has consistently received a superior rating, the highest state award given for facilities and maintenance. In addition, FSU was also recently ranked safest college campus in the state.

Today, the University's mission and services have expanded significantly. Over 400 full-time administrators and support staff, and more than 200 full-time faculty serve the educational needs of students who come not only from throughout the United States, but also the world. These students have a choice of 37 major programs of study leading to the Bachelor of Art, Bachelor of Science, Bachelor of Fine Arts and Bachelor of Technical and Professional Studies degrees as well as graduate degrees in applied ecology and conservation biology, business administration, counseling psychology, education, wildlife/fisheries biology, human performance, modern humanities, park and recreation resource management, teaching and applied computer science. In addition, 12 pre-professional programs are offered.

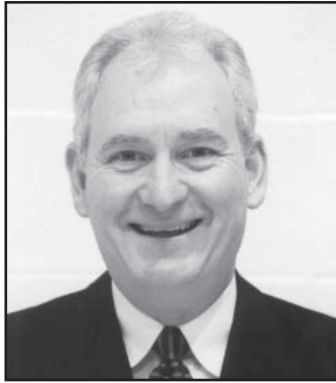


FSU AT A GLANCE

Ninth Season

Webb Hatch begins his ninth season as the head men's basketball coach at Frostburg State University as well as his 34th year of coaching.

Over the last eight seasons, Hatch has led the Bobcats to an 103-113 overall record, one Allegheny Mountain Collegiate Conference Tournament championship, a pair of AMCC Tournament second-place finishes and one Eastern College Athletic Conference South Region Runner-Up showing.

The Bobcats finished the 2006-07 season with a 10-16 overall record and an even 9-9 mark in the AMCC. Hatch's squad was again a dominant force on the glass in the AMCC as the team finished the season ranked second in rebounding margin (+2.1) and rebounding offense (38.2) and fourth in rebounding defense (36.1). Frostburg State was third in steals (9.77), fourth in assists per game (13.46) and fifth in both blocked shots (2.73) and scoring offense (70.2). Junior Antione McCall took home All-AMCC second team honors at the end of the season after leading the Bobcats in scoring (14.5).

FSU finished with a 12-15 overall record and an 8-10 AMCC mark in the 2005-06. The Bobcats had a promising start, opening the year 3-1 and taking fifth place in the Pride of Maryland Tournament. FSU fell to McDaniel in the opening round but captured wins over Salisbury (70-62) and Hood (65-63). However, Frostburg State would struggle through the regular season and earn a No. 6 seed in the AMCC Tournament. In the opening round, the Bobcats defeated the No. 3 seeded Penn State Behrend Lions 59-54. In the second round, FSU fell to No. 2 seeded Pitt-Greensburg, 69-54.

Hatch and the Bobcats finished 14-12 overall and 9-9 in the AMCC in 2004-05, dropping five games by single digits. FSU was the sixth seed in the AMCC Tournament and fell to third-seeded Lake Erie 85-67 in the first round. The Bobcats owned a 13-6 overall and 8-4 AMCC mark but lost two starters due to violations of team rules and dropped six of their final seven games to end the year. Junior forward/center Daniel Ryley was FSU's lone selection to the All-AMCC squad, earning second-team honors.

In 2003-04, Hatch led a young Bobcat squad to a 15-13 overall record and a strong run to the AMCC Championship game, where FSU dropped a heart-breaking 44-42 overtime contest to La Roche. The Bobcats won their last two regular-season AMCC games to secure the No. 3 seed and a first-round home game in the AMCC Tournament, where it edged Lake Erie 67-66. The Bobcats then toppled No. 2 Pitt-Greensburg 57-51 in the semifinals before dropping the title game in overtime for the second time in three seasons. Hatch joined the Frostburg State staff in late August 1999 and needed just one year to turn around the Bobcats. After a 6-19 overall record and a 2-10 mark in the AMCC in his first season, Hatch's second squad went 20-10 (8-4 AMCC), the biggest improvement from the previous season by any NCAA Division III program in the country.

The Bobcats captured their first-ever AMCC Tournament championship and earned a berth to the ECAC Southern Region Championship Tournament for the eighth time in school history. FSU made a thrilling run to the title game, downing Bethany (W.Va.), 99-83, and edging Alvernia, 77-71, before falling to King's, 70-60, in the championship contest. The Bobcats ranked 30th in the nation in scoring (82.0 ppg) and 34th in rebounding margin (+5.5 rpg). The 20 wins were the second-highest in program history (trailing only the 1970-71 squad that finished 24-4), and the AMCC title was the first conference tournament championship in team history. FSU also set single-season team records for rebounds (1,285) and assists (463).

In 2001-02, Hatch and the Bobcats continued their success, posting a 16-12 overall record and a 9-3 mark in the AMCC. The team advanced to the AMCC championship game for the second straight year before falling in an exciting overtime contest. The team also improved its scoring average to 83.1 points per game and outscored opponents by an average of 5.3 points per game.

FSU's combined 36 wins over the 2000-01 and 2001-02 seasons is the second-highest two-year total in the program's history (trailing only the 37 wins from 1970-1972). In 2002-03, the Bobcats endured a tough 1-6 start before rebounding with five wins in their next seven games. Season-ending injuries to two key players and the loss of a third player to military service took their toll as the Bobcats dropped six straight contests. However, FSU hung tough to win four of its final six regular-season games before losing in overtime in the first round of the AMCC Tournament to finish with 10-16 overall and 5-7 in the AMCC. The Bobcats suffered nine losses by 10 points or less.

Hatch came to Frostburg after having served as an assistant at Virginia Military Institute, his alma mater, for the 1998-99 season. Prior to his stint at VMI, Hatch was the first-ever head men's basketball coach at Division III Marymount University in Arlington, Va., for 10 seasons, where he also served as the school's assistant athletic director and sports information director.

Hatch led Marymount to a 13-9 record in his debut season. In 1990-91, he earned Capital Athletic Conference Coach of the Year honors after guiding the Saints to the CAC regular-season championship and a 16-11 overall record. He also led Marymount to an 18-10 record and the CAC Tournament championship in 1991-92. His Marymount teams also advanced to the CAC tournament championship game in the 1990-91 and 1995-96 seasons.

Prior to Marymount, Hatch served as an assistant coach at Virginia Wesleyan College in Norfolk, Va., from 1977 to 1987, where he helped coach the Marlins to two Dixie Conference championships and three NCAA Division III Tournament appearances.

Additionally, Hatch served as head coach at Nansemond-Suffolk Academy in Suffolk, Va., from 1975 to 1977. He coached the boys' team to a 23-3 record and the VAAC championship in the 1976-77 season, and he was also an assistant football coach and social studies teacher at the school.

Hatch began his coaching career as an assistant at Prince George (Va.) High School in 1969-70 prior to a two-year tour of duty in the United States Army. He has also organized, promoted and directed summer basketball camps for the past 25 years.

Hatch received his bachelor's degree in history from VMI in 1969 and later earned a master's degree in education from Old Dominion University in 1985.

Sean Brown begins his second stint as part of the Frostburg State men's basketball coaching staff in 2007-08. He will serve as the team's top assistant after serving as a graduate assistant in the 2004-05 season and a student assistant from 2002-04.

Over the last two years, Brown served as an assistant coach for the South Side Academy in Baltimore, Md. While there, he assisted with player development, monitored academics and assisted with the schedule and break down of practices. Brown was a former standout player for the Frostburg State Bobcats. Brown began his playing career at Frostburg State in 1997-98 before transferring to Prince George's Community College for a year. There, he earned team MVP honors after averaging 14.0 points and 7.0 assists per game. Brown then returned to FSU for his junior and senior seasons and helped lead the team to a 36-22 record, the second-best two-year win total in school history.

As a junior, Brown sparked the Bobcats to a 20-10 record, the Allegheny Mountain Collegiate Conference Tournament championship and a runner-up showing in the Eastern College Athletic Conference South Championship. He averaged 11.8 points, led the team in steals (66), assists (167) and three-point percentage (46.2) and shot 51.3 percent from the floor to earn All-AMCC honorable mention honors.

As a senior, Brown helped the Bobcats to a 16-12 record and a runner-up finish in the AMCC Tournament. He earned first-team All-AMCC honors after averaging 15.6 points, 4.5 rebounds and 5.6 assists, while pacing the Bobcats with 69 steals.



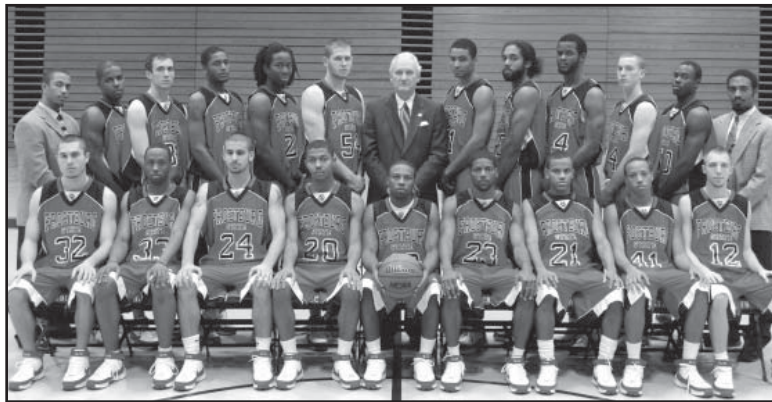
Jonathan Mason

The importance of senior leadership can never be understated and the 2007-08 Frostburg State men's basketball squad knows just how important that really is. Four seniors, all returning starters from a year ago, accent a 19-member squad this season as the Bobcats gear up for an AMCC Title run under ninth-year head coach Webb Hatch.

Bobcat fans can expect to see many of the same faces from a year ago as seniors **Brian Green (Baltimore, Md./Archbishop Curley)**, **Dale DeBerry (Upper Marlboro, Md./Riverdale Baptist)**, **Jermaine Kapombe (Washington, D.C./Friendly)** and **Jade Belt (Baltimore, Md./Perry Hall)** make up the backbone of the 07-08 edition of the FSU men's basketball team. The four have combined for 1,158 points and 415 rebounds during their collective careers.

Green will once again run the Bobcat offense from the point guard position. Green is a quick and elusive ball handler who started 24 games last winter. He led the team and finished fifth in the conference with 102 assists. He also led the team in steals (47) and finished second in three-pointers made (24).

DeBerry started in 23 games a year ago and returns as the team's leading scorer (12.8 ppg). DeBerry was third on the team with 23 three pointers and 31 steals and finished third in assists (41).

Kapombe played in 22 games last season and started in eight of the final nine contests. He averaged 4.4 ppg and 2.3 rpg and should be a solid contributor to this year's lineup.

Belt is the team's top returning post player after starting in 16 games last year. He is the top returning rebounder (6.3 rpg), while averaging 6.4 ppg in 06-07. Belt is the team's best defensive post player and a strong presence inside.

FSU will also look to two additional letterwinners for contribution this season; juniors **Juan Wansley (Odenton, Md./Arundel)** and **Carter Simmons (Annapolis, Md./Southern)**. Wansley is a hard working and very coachable post player who averaged 2.3 ppg and 2.4 rpg in 21 games last season. Simmons is a student of the game and has shown steady improvement throughout the preseason and will look to battle for a starting position in the post. He appeared in 19 games a year ago and will use his knowledge of the Bobcat offense to see more time on the floor this year.

Three sophomores round out the returning players from last season for the Bobcats. **Anthony Guy (Washington, D.C./Good Counsel)** gained valuable experience last season at the point guard position. He is a quick player and good ball handler who will battle for time throughout the season. Last season, he played in 26 games and finished second on the team with 51 assists. He also added 12 three pointers and 15 steals.

Paul Shockley (Leesburg, Va./Heritage) is one of the team's best shooters and should compete for time at either the guard or forward positions. In 25 games last year, he made 12 three pointers and averaged 4.6 points per game. He also grabbed 65 rebounds and registered 24 steals.

Brandon Gilliam (Yonkers, N.Y./Yonkers) is an athletic guard/forward and has the potential to see time at both positions throughout the 2007-08 year after appearing in 11 games last season.

Along with the list of returners, 10 freshmen will also battle for playing time for the Bobcats; **Brian Anderson (Perry Hall, Md./Eastern Tech)**, **Jamal Bracken (Baltimore, Md./Eastern Tech)**, **Martin Fernandez (Germantown, Md./Northwest)**, **Korawn Harris (Baltimore, Md./Edmondson Westside)**, **Japp Haynes (Baltimore, Md./Calvert Hall)**, **Lloyd McCleave (Abingdon, Md./Calvert Hall)**, **Steven Ogg (Arlington, Va./Yorktown)**, **Busha Koffa (Germantown, Md./Seneca Valley)**, **Blake Walker (Frostburg, Md./Northern Garrett)**, and **James**

Wright (Upper Marlboro, Md./Bowie).

Anderson is a smart player and excellent shooter who will see playing time at the guard position. He was Eastern's Most Valuable Player as a junior. Bracken has good ability but is adjusting to being a perimeter player after starting on the inside at Eastern. He was an all-county selection as a both a junior and senior at Eastern.

Fernandez is a very gifted player who possesses good shooting and ball handling ability. He should see more time as he adjusts to the college game. He was a Gazette Honorable Mention selection as a senior in high school.

Harris and Haynes are athletic players who will provide depth to the FSU lineup. Harris is a point guard while Haynes is a post player.

McCleave is a talented guard/forward with good athleticism. He is a good defender and will compete for time on the floor this season.

Ogg has been a pleasant surprise to the coaching staff this season. He is an extremely hard worker and a fundamentally sound basketball player. He has learned the offense very quickly and will compete for time with his versatility as either a guard or forward.

Koffa is a very active post player for Frostburg State. He rebounds well and has good shot blocking ability. Koffa has worked hard in the preseason and should push for playing time this year.

Walker is a reserve forward who is an intelligent player who will see time as he grasps the FSU system.

Wright gives the team added depth at the forward/center position. Like most of the freshmen, his playing time will depend on how quickly he adjusts to college level competition and learning the FSU offenses and defenses.

The 2007-08 schedule will again be a challenge for Frostburg State as it will see tough competition in two tournaments in the early part of the season. FSU opens at the V Foundation Classic where it will face Shenandoah and York/Roanoke. The Bobcats will also travel to the Marietta Shrine Classic over the holiday season where they will face Grove City and Waynesburg.

Frostburg State was selected to finish fifth in the Allegheny Mountain Collegiate Conference regular season as voted on by the league's head coaches. Lake Erie and Penn State Behrend split the preseason votes from the league crown right down the middle and thus earned a split decision.

"Being picked to finish in the middle of the AMCC seems reasonable to me," said Hatch. "I believe we can compete with anyone in the conference. If some of our new players develop over the course of the season, we could be pretty good in late February when the AMCC Tournament is played."

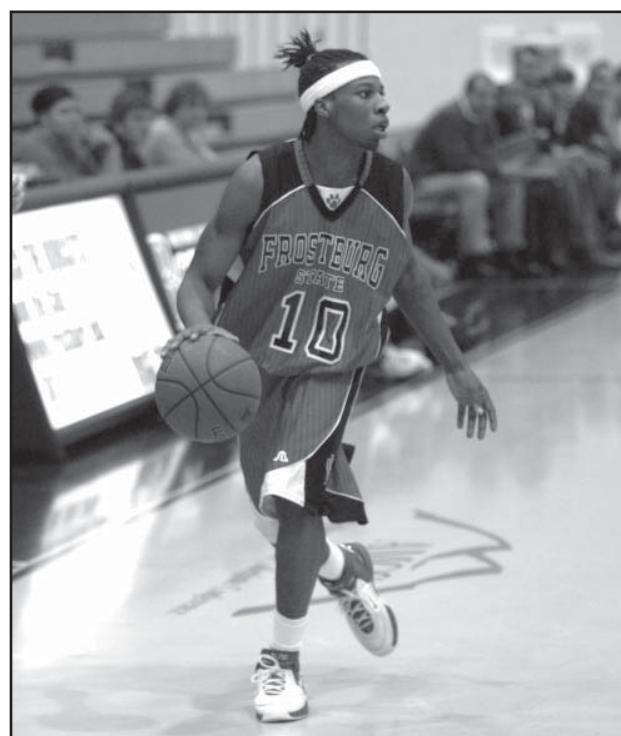
