**Keith Byrnes**  
Head Coach

Keith Byrnes enters his fifth season as head coach of the Frostburg State men's soccer program. Byrnes has led the Bobcats to a 38-34-6 overall record, including a 19-10-1 mark in the Allegheny Mountain Collegiate Conference.

Traditionally, the Bobcats have opened the season against some of the toughest teams in the nation. In 2005, the Bobcats started the season 1-6 but rebounded to win five out of their next six contests. All five of the FSU wins during that stretch came via shutout as the Bobcats outscored their opponents 17-0. Frostburg State would close out the regular season with a 2-2 record and earn a No. 5 seed in the AMCC Tournament. FSU eliminated Penn State Behrend 2-1 in the opening round but fell to eventual league champion Medaille, 1-0, in double overtime.

After starting the 2004 season 1-3, including a loss to No. 9 St. Lawrence, FSU gained momentum going 6-1-1. The Bobcats started AMCC action 3-0 before injuries took their toll and the team finished with a 5-3-1 league mark. FSU earned the No. 4 seed in the AMCC Tournament and downed rival Penn State Behrend 3-1 in the first round. The Bobcats then lost to eventual champion Pitt-Greensburg 2-1 in the semifinals to finish the year 11-8-2.

In his second season, the Bobcats overcame a rough start before hitting their stride en route to a 10-7-2 finish, including a 5-1 mark in the AMCC. After suffering three one-goal losses to open the season, FSU hit its stride in a 9-1-2 stretch and was ranked as high as seventh in the NCAA Mid-Atlantic Region poll and eighth in the NSCAA regional poll.

The Bobcats tied for the AMCC regular-season title, were the runners-up in the AMCC Tournament and advanced to the ECAC Tournament for the 14th time in school history. Five FSU players were named to the All-AMCC team, including senior Mike Mutchler, who was also selected to the NSCAA/adidas Mid-Atlantic Regional All-America second team.

In his first year at the helm, Byrnes led the Bobcats to an 8-9-2 overall record and a 3-3 mark in the AMCC. After struggling to find the net in an 0-3-2 start, Byrnes' squad went on a tear, winning eight of its next 11, including a season-high five in a row. FSU, which suffered four one-goal losses, had six All-AMCC selections.

Byrnes came to Frostburg after a two-year stint as the part-time head coach at Plymouth State (N.H.) College, where he led the Panthers to a 29-11 overall record and a pair of post-season appearances.

In his first season at Plymouth State, Byrnes guided the Panthers to Little East Conference regular-season and tournament championships and a berth in the NCAA Division III Tournament. PSC advanced to the second round and finished with a 15-5 overall record.

Byrnes then led the Panthers to a 14-6 overall mark in 2001, finishing as the runner-up in the LEC and winning the ECAC New England Tournament Championship.

Plymouth State earned strong regional and national rankings under Byrnes, and the Panthers boasted the Little East Conference Player of the Year in both 2000 and 2001.

A 1995 graduate of Plattsburgh State (N.Y.), where he played four years for the Cardinals, Byrnes was an assistant coach at his



## John Witkowski Assistant Coach

John Witkowski enters his fifth year as the assistant coach of the Frostburg State men's soccer program.

Witkowski, a four-year letterwinner at Hartwick, played for the legendary Jim Lennox in one of the top Division I programs in the country. Witkowski earned numerous academic honors, including the Philip S. Wilder, Jr. Award for Academic Distinction three years in a row.

A former forward and midfielder, Witkowski serves as coordinator of the FSU Soccer Camp and is the head coach of the Bobcats' jayvee team. He is also an associate professor in the FSU Health, Physical Education and Recreation department.

Witkowski earned bachelor's degrees in both business management and accounting as well as minors in economics, finance and religious studies from Hartwick in May 2002. He is a member of both the NSCAA and USSF and holds the NSCAA Premier, Advanced National, National and Goalkeeping Regional diplomas. He also has an NSCAA Director of Coaching diploma and a National Youth diploma.

Witkowski, who completed his master's degree in human performance from Frostburg State in December 2004, is involved with the Maryland Youth Soccer Association as a District Development Coach.



Witkowski is the top assistant coach for the Bobcat varsity team and the head coach for the jayvee team.



## Brandon Rethemeyer Assistant Coach

Brandon Rethemeyer enters his second season as an assistant coach with the Frostburg State men's soccer team.

Rethemeyer was a goalkeeper for the Bobcats in the 2003 and 2004 seasons helping FSU to a combined 21-15-4 overall record including one ECAC Tournament appearance. As a senior in 2004, Rethemeyer was 1-1 with a shutout and a .778 save percentage.

Rethemeyer not only brings playing knowledge to the Bobcat staff but a solid resume of coaching experience as well. He has been an instructor at both the Rich Daughtridge Soccer Camps and the Denison Cabral Soccer Academy.

Rethemeyer graduated this past May with his bachelor's degree in health and physical education. He currently is a graduate assistant in the sports information office while working on his master's degree in education.



## Bryn Varhol Student Assistant Coach

Bryn Varhol enters his first season as a student assistant coach with the Frostburg State men's soccer team.

Varhol, a former goalkeeper with the Bobcats from 2002-2005, saw action in 24 games, posted a career 1.35 goals against average, and recorded six shutouts. He helped FSU reach one AMCC Championship game and one ECAC Tournament appearance. As a senior in 2005, he was a captain for the Bobcats and he received the AMCC and ECAC Mid-Atlantic Goalkeeper of the Week Award (Sept. 26). Varhol was also the recipient of the Gilbert Gray Award, which was voted on by his teammates.

While participating in a semester abroad program, Varhol played with Mary Immaculate College in Limerick, Ireland. He recently completed the NSCAA Advanced Regional Diploma and he's been an FSU team camp counselor.

Varhol plans to graduate in May with his bachelor's degree in business administration.

## BOBCATS AIMING FOR

The Bobcats are looking to build on their strong finish from the 2005 season. FSU, despite posting a 9-10 overall record, finished the regular season winning seven of their last ten games. After advancing to the semifinals of the AMCC tournament for the ninth consecutive season the Bobcats were knocked off in double overtime, 1-0, by eventual conference champion Medaille.

The Bobcats also look to continue their stellar play at home, where they posted six shutouts last season.

The 2006 offense will be under new leadership with the graduation of three-time all-conference performer Matt Moffa. Seniors **Steve Zoutman** (Chester, N.Y./Goshen) and **Jeff Bisker** (Fallston, Md./Fallston) along with junior **Trevor Havey** (Eldersburg, Md./Liberty) will be looked to pick up the goal scoring for the Bobcats.

Zoutman has been a mainstay in the Bobcat defense since 2003 but will be moved to the offensive end where he recorded five goals and two assists his freshman year.

Havey netted three goals and two assists last year and will look to regain the form from his freshman year where he earned second-team all-conference honors.

Bisker has added depth to the Bobcat frontline the past three seasons and his speed and athletic ability help bring a high energy level to the attack off the bench.

The midfield will be anchored by a pair all-conference players. Junior **Kenny Dotter** (Baltimore, Md./Sparrows Point) who was a first-team all-league honoree last season posted five goals and three assists from his outside midfield position. Dotter's tremendous speed and tenacious work rate make him a nightmare for opposing defenders.

Sophomore **Gregg Laskow** (Plainsboro, N.J./WWP-North) was an honorable-mention All-AMCC selection in 2005 after scoring three goals and posting two assists. This season, he will be asked to move inside to anchor the middle with his playmaking ability.

Senior **Sean Quealy** (Massapequa Park, N.Y./Massapequa) notched a goal and an assist last fall and will once again be looked upon to contribute from his outside midfield position by creating scoring opportunities with his speed and one-on-one attacking ability.

A pair of juniors, **Sean Tana** (Baldwin, Md./Loyola Blakefield) and **Alex Wilkinson** (La Vale, Md./Bishop Walsh), will patrol the midfield with Laskow. Tana brings more of the goal scoring and playmaking mentality to the middle while Wilkinson is there to disrupt the opposition's offensive flow and start the counter attack.

The Bobcat defense will have plenty of veteran leadership for the 2006 campaign. Second-team all-conference selection **Adam Gracia** (Rockville, Md./Thomas Wootton) returns after starting every game his freshman campaign. Gracia's tremendous technical ability makes him an offensive threat every time he touches the ball.

Sophomore **Sean Jones** (Pasadena, Md./Severna Park) will be the heart of the Bobcat backline. Jones' insertion into the starting line-up last season really solidified the back line and sparked the defensive turn around. The Red and Black once again welcome the return of junior **Andrew Appelbaum** (Severn, Md./Old Mill). Appelbaum, a former Maryland All-State selection has suffered season ending injuries in both his freshman and sophomore seasons. He is once again healthy and

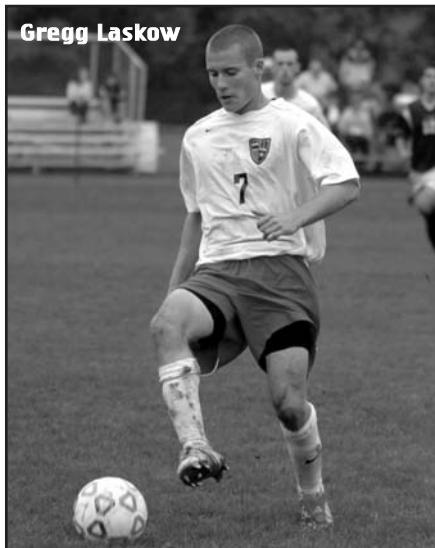


In the weeks leading up to AMCC competition, FSU will travel to Bethany (W.Va.), St. Mary's and Johns Hopkins and host Albright and Franklin & Marshall. Bethany finished last year with a 12-6-1 overall record and a runner-up finish in the President's Athletic Conference Tournament while St. Mary's finished 12-7-1 overall and third in the Capital Athletic Conference. JHU was 14-2-5 last fall and captured its fourth ECAC Championship and Franklin & Marshall will again be a tough team after a 8-5-3 record.

FSU opens league play with last seasons runner-up, Lake Erie. The Bobcats will also welcome reigning conference champion Medaille, rival Penn State Behrend and La Roche to Bobcat Stadium in 2006.

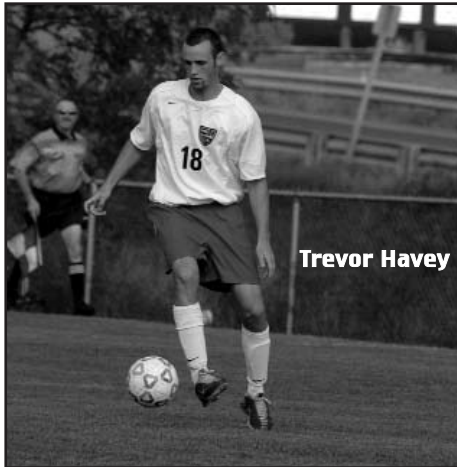

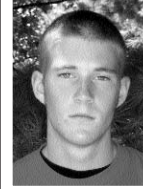

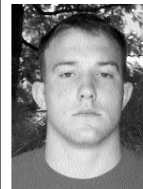

Frostburg State's Bobcat Stadium has recently seen the addition of Sprinturf on its playing field this past spring. Sprinturf is the leading American-owned installer and manufacturer of synthetic turf systems. Sprinturf revolutionized the industry by patenting and installing the first non-abrasive, non-compacting, all-rubber infill system.

Five FSU sports will directly benefit from the newly renovated field; including football, men's and women's soccer, track & field as well as women's lacrosse. Intramurals will also have a chance to host their activities on the new field.

The addition of Sprinturf is the second renovation to Bobcat Stadium since the fall of 2005. In September, the Stadium, which was built in 1974, saw the addition of 95 stadium lights.

Men's soccer will take advantage of the newly renovated stadium by hosting an opening season tournament under the lights on Friday, September 1-2. On Friday at 5:30 pm, Gettysburg will take on Waynesburg and at 7:30 pm the Bobcats will face Neumann. The two losing teams will square off in the consolation game at 11:00 am on Saturday and while the championship game will be played at 1:00 pm.
