Wes Landrum

College: Frostburg State

Head Coach

Wes Landrum enters his third year as head coach of the Frostburg State women's softball program after serving as the interim head coach from April to June, 2005.

Last year, Landrum guided the Bobcats to a 16-19 overall record and an 11-7 AMCC slate. FSU was 9-1 at home but struggled away from Bobcat Field posting a 7-18 record. Frostburg State finished the regular season fifth in the AMCC (11-7) and was eliminated in the conference tournament opening round, with a 3-2 setback to Medaille.

Five players earned All-AMCC honors including the league's Co-Newcomer of the Year, Katelyn Coffey.

In 2006, FSU finished 24-18 overall and 13-5 in the Allegheny Mountain Collegiate Conference. The Bobcats opened the season with a 3-7 record before winning 12 of the next 14 contests.

Frostburg State entered the AMCC Tournament as the No. 4 seeded team and defeated No. 5 seed La Roche in the opening round. The Bobcats won game one 4-3 and game two 1-0. In the conference finals, FSU was eliminated with losses to top-seeded Penn State Behrend (3-0) and third seeded Lake Erie (3-1).

FSU placed four players on the all-conference team including three first-team selections. Amanda Baldwin was named to the NFCA All-Region team and Bethany Seyler earned CoSIDA Academic All-District honors.

In 2005, Landrum led the Bobcats to 17-19 overall record and an 11-7 mark in the AMCC. FSU finished fourth in the AMCC regular-season standings and was also fourth at the AMCC Tournament.

Landrum took over the Bobcats with a 5-8 record and guided the team to 11 victories in its next 14 games, including six straight wins to close out that stretch, which pushed FSU to 16-11 overall and 11-1 in the AMCC.

Bad weather forced the Bobcats to close out the regular

season with three key AMCC road doubleheaders in a four-day span, and FSU dropped all six contests, including four by just a single run, to fall to 16-17 overall and 11-7 in the league.

FSU earned the No. 4 seed in the AMCC Tournament and downed No. 5 Hilbert 14-0 in a single-elimination play-in game before dropping 4-2 contests to No. 1 La Roche and No. 6 Penn State Behrend in the double-elimination championship round.

Seven Bobcat players earned All-AMCC honors, including three who were named to the first team.

Landrum began his coaching career as FSU's top assistant in the fall of 2002 and helped the Bobcats quickly become one of the top teams in the AMCC.

After a 13-12 showing in 2003, FSU enjoyed record-breaking success in 2004, finishing 26-14 overall and 11-1 in the AMCC. The Bobcats set 28 school records, including marks for overall and conference victories.

The Bobcats claimed their first-ever regular-season AMCC title, hosted the AMCC Tournament for the first time and earned a berth in the Eastern College Athletic Conference Tournament, the first post-season invitation in the program's history.

Landrum has coached 22 All-AMCC selections, including the 2003 and 2007 Newcomer's of the Year and the 2004 Co-Player of the Year.

FSU has also enjoyed great success in the classroom during Landrum's coaching tenure, ranking among the top National Fastpitch Coaches Association Division III academic squads in 2004. The Bobcats have also had four NFCA All-America Scholar-Athlete selections over the past few years and a CoSIDA Academic All-District selection.



Amber Nichols

College: Thiel

Assistant Coach

Amber Nichols enters her first season as an assistant coach with the women's softball team after graduating from Thiel College this past May.

She came to Frostburg after a successful softball career at TC. Nichols was a three-year player earning first-team all-conference honors in 2007. She was also recognized as the Presidents' Athletic Conference Hitter of the Week and SAAC Scholar Athlete of the Month in March of her senior

season. Nichols received CoSIDA/ESPN the Magazine Academic All-District Second Team and NFCA Div. III All-Region Second Team honors.

Nichols graduated in the spring of 2007 from Thiel College with her bachelor's degree in english.



This season, there are numerous questions about the youth on the Frostburg State softball team. However, with seven seniors and juniors mixed with nine sophomores and freshmen, head coach Wes Landrum is confident that his young team will be just fine.

The Bobcats not only return five seniors, but three All-Allegheny Mountain Collegiate Conference performers from a year ago including the league's Co-Newcomer of the Year. The Bobcats also welcome back four of their top five hitters from last spring and Landrum is optimistic about the upcoming season.

"We should be right in the mix this season," said Landrum. "Our goal is to win the conference and get that automatic bid. If we can continue to grow both offensively and defensively, we should be in the mix at the end of the season."

Seniors **Amanda Baldwin (Baltimore, Md./North County)** and **Meghan Dabkowski (Eastnorthport, N.Y./Commack)** return as the only four-year players on the 2008 Bobcat roster.

Baldwin, a co-captain for the spring season, returns for her final year as the team's catcher after starting in every game in each of the last two seasons. This spring she will see a majority at catcher but could also play at short stop and third



base. She has become a great leader for the Bobcats and will look to improve her offensive numbers from a year ago. She hit .271 with 26 hits and 10 RBIs.

Dabkowski will see most of her playing time this spring in the outfield. She has flourished in the outfield after moving to the position last spring. Offensively, Dabkowski put up career-high numbers last year. She had 21 hits and was third on the team in batting average (.304), slugging percentage (.348) and RBIs (12).

Senior **Lindsay Seal (Mt. Airy, Md./Linganore)** enters the season as the starter at third base after solidifying the infield last spring. She had 32 putouts at third last spring and will look to expand her hitting this season. The coaching staff is very happy with her defense and looks for improvement on her .235 batting average and 23 hits from last season.

**Heather Proud (Cresaptown, Md./Allegheny)** joins Baldwin as the other co-captain for the 2008 Bobcats. She will be looked upon to improve her offensive numbers after coming off an injury during her junior season. She will continue her team leadership both on and off the field this season.

**Lindsay Durkin (Damascus, Md./Damascus)** rounds out the 2008 senior class and will look to contribute to the pitching staff and outfield again this season. She did well with the opportunities that she was provided with last spring and will look to improve on her overall numbers.

The Bobcats have just two juniors this spring: **Kaitlyn Wagner (Leesburg, Va./Loudoun County)** and **Jayme Miller (Accident, Md./Northern Garrett)**.

Wagner enters the spring season as the team's starting shortstop. Wagner, who has the strongest arm on the team, made the move to SS after starting 28 games at second base as a freshman. She hit .236 last season and will look to improve on her offensive numbers this year.

Miller, a transfer from nearby Garrett College, is a good athlete and will compete for playing time in several positions this spring.

Five sophomores will help contribute to the Bobcat lineup this season.

**Katelyn Coffey (Middletown, Md./Middletown)** should have the most impact of any sophomore this season. She enters the spring as the team's top starting pitcher. The 2007 AMCC Newcomer of the Year, will pitch in big games for the

Bobcats and should improve with every start. She had a very good freshman campaign posting a 9-6 overall record with 59 strikeouts and a 2.58 ERA. Against the AMCC, Coffey was 6-2 with 33 strikeouts and 1.73 ERA including a perfect game against Penn State Altoona in early April.

**Kelly Filipowicz (Elkridge, Md./Long Reach)** led Frostburg State in many offensive categories last spring including batting average (.390), slugging percentage (.403) and on base percentage (.397). She learned to become a slap hitter last season and has a huge growth potential at the plate and on defense at second base.

**Amber Macintosh (Point of Rocks, Md./Brunswick)** is coming off a very good year offensively for the Bobcats where she led the team in runs scored (20), hits (32) and stolen bases (7). She also became a slap hitter in the preseason last spring and managed to hit .317. She will battle for a starting position in the outfield.

**Samantha Quirin (Lovettsville, Va./Loudoun Valley)** started in every game last spring at first base for the Bobcats. She is a vocal leader on the field and will look to improve on her offensive numbers this season.

**Lindsay Freitag (Baltimore, Md./Parkville)** enters the season as the probable starter in center field after making the switch from infield last season. She has a strong arm and is very athletic and will also look to improve on her offensive numbers from last spring.

**Kelly Callan (Silver Spring, Md./Springbrook)** heads the class of four freshmen this spring as she enters the preseason as the squads' No. 2 starting pitcher. She has great velocity and will primarily focus on adjusting to the collegiate level.

**Victoria Krichbaum (Olney, Md./Sherwood)** will see time in both the infield and outfield this spring. She will contribute offensively at the plate and will be productive in the field with her versatility.

**Kathryn Claeys (Sterling, Va./Dominion)** will also contribute to the Bobcats seeing time in the outfield or even as a pitcher. She has a nice swing and could see time on the mound in relief of Coffey and Callan.

**Brooke Tapman (Pocomoke, Md./Pocomoke)** could see time in both the infield and outfield this season. She is the fastest player on the team and is very athletic. Also a field hockey player for FSU, Tapman has the athleticism to play



numerous positions.

Head Coach Wes Landrum adds a new member to his staff in 2008. Amber Nichols has joined the Bobcats as an assistant coach after a three-year playing career at Thiel College. Nichols was an all-conference player for TC and was a CoSIDA/ESPN the Magazine Academic All-District Second Team and NFCA Div. III All-Region Second Team selection.

As always, coach Landrum schedules tough teams early on in the season to prepare his club for a conference title run. The Bobcats open the season at the Beach Blast in Virginia Beach, Va. There, FSU will face three NCAA Tournament teams; Christopher Newport, Methodist and top-25 ranked Lynchburg.

Two weeks later, Frostburg State travels to Myrtle Beach for the Annual Snowbird Classic. FSU usually faces some tough NCAA Div. II and NAIA teams that will prepare it for its conference schedule which opens March 29th at Lake Erie.

"We should be very competitive in the AMCC this year," said Landrum. "The key is to stay healthy and keep getting better."

From an opening day enrollment of 57 students, Frostburg State University has grown to a present day enrollment of over 5,000 students. Its physical plant, once limited to a single building, Old Main, which housed classrooms and a library, has also grown to over 30 facilities including classroom buildings, residence halls, the Lewis J. Ort Library, the Harold J. Cordts Physical Education Center, the Lane Center, and the Performing Arts Center, situated on 255 beautiful acres.

Opened in 1902 as State Normal School No. 2, the University owes its existence to the tenacity of J. Benson Oder, editor of the Frostburg Mining Journal, and the citizens of Frostburg who, in spite of political barriers, raised funds and purchased the site on which the University is located.

Over the years, the name of the institution has reflected the changes in the scope of its educational mission. In 1935, the State Normal School No. 2 became the State Teachers College at Frostburg, a four-year college which offered a Bachelor of Science in Elementary Education. In 1963, the name became Frostburg State College, and finally in 1987, with the strong support of the local civic and business community, became Frostburg State University, an indication of its growing resources, diversity and excellence in educational opportunities for the region and the state.

In 1988, FSU became a constituent institution of the University System of Maryland, comprised of 11 of the state's 13 public institutions.



### EDGEWOOD COMMONS

Expanding to meet the educational needs of the region, the FSU Center in Hagerstown was also established in 1988 to offer upper-level bachelor's degree coursework and graduate programs. The University also opened, in 1990, a permanent location for the Frederick MBA program.

Throughout its growth, the University has emphasized excellence in teaching. Over 80% of the full-time faculty hold Ph.D.s or terminal degrees from institutions that are among the most prestigious in the nation. Faculty scholarship has led to scholarly books, manuals and journals, as well as numerous articles and reviews. This excellence in faculty has resulted in superior results for students. FSU has been ranked first among its peers for the number of doctorates per 100 baccalaureate degrees awarded. In the same study, FSU was ranked second in the percentage of national, prestigious awards received by faculty. These have included Fulbrights and significant grants from the National Endowment for the Humanities, the National Endowment for the Arts and other national associations.

At the same time, the University has developed comparable excellence in academic programs, research, consulting, cultural and athletic events, and facilities. In recent years the campus has consistently received a superior rating, the highest state award given for facilities and maintenance. In addition, FSU was also recently ranked safest college campus in the state.

Today, the University's mission and services have expanded significantly. Over 400 full-time administrators and support staff, and more than 200 full-time faculty serve the educational needs of students who come not only from throughout the United States, but also the world. These students have a choice of 37 major programs of study leading to the Bachelor of Art, Bachelor of Science, Bachelor of Fine Arts and Bachelor of Technical and Professional Studies degrees as well as graduate degrees in applied ecology and conservation biology, business administration, counseling psychology, education, wildlife/fisheries biology, human performance, modern humanities, park and recreation resource management, teaching and applied computer science. In addition, 12 pre-professional programs are offered.

Frostburg State University continues its pursuit of excellence. It is a tradition which now spans over a century.
